Our school

Established 40 years ago, we offer an innovative and creative high-quality teaching program compliant with the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA). Sustainability and environmental education are integral to our school, in both practice and teaching. The school is governed by a management committee comprised of parents, who work together with the teaching coordinator and staff to combine professional and personal experience in the management of the school.

We have approximately 50 students from Kindergarten to Year 6. Our size means smaller classes, and the added advantage of knowing and nurturing each child in a child safe environment.

Position overview

The successful candidate will have the appropriate teaching qualifications in the area of Learning and Support Education, be self-motivated, have effective time management skills, attention to detail, excellent organisational skills, and will have previous experience with identifying students with learning needs and developing appropriate support for these students. This rewarding position will require the successful candidate to show initiative, meet deadlines and be multi-skilled to support teachers and teachers' aides in achieving student outcomes.

Teachers at Tutable are progressive in their attitudes towards educational change and are constantly updating through professional development to enhance teaching and learning. The curriculum development process is, therefore, one of continual review and refinement.

The Learning and Support Teacher will provide specialist assistance to students with additional learning and support needs and will work collaboratively with the classroom teacher to support assessment for learning of these students and identify specific learning and support needs

The Learning and Support Teacher role is an integral part of the school team. The Learning and Support Teacher works closely with the teachers and teachers' aides to provide direct support for students with additional learning and support needs through a range of strategies (including direct instruction, delivery of adjusted learning programs, assessment and monitoring of progress) including the areas of social integration, language and communication, literacy, numeracy, and behaviour. This may include students with confirmed disabilities.

Required

- Bachelor of Education (Primary) 4-year degree
- Qualifications in Special Education and knowledge of, and experience with, supporting students with additional needs
- NES A Teacher Accreditation and WWCC clearance
- First Aid Certificate, Child Protection and Anaphylaxis training
- Training in a synthetic phonics program such as Sounds Write desirable

Selection Criteria

We want to deliver an evidence-based education to provide opportunities for all our students to achieve academic success. In Literacy we have started our whole school journey using the synthetic phonics program Sounds Write.

The applicant for this position would need to meet the following criteria:

- Expert knowledge of data collection and analysis and can lead the school in best practice.
- Experience in delivering and reviewing teaching strategies and making adjustments and accommodations that support the learning of students with special additional needs, including behaviour support.
- Experience in development and ongoing case management of individualised Student Learning Plans, with demonstrated ability to plan, implement, model, and review adjustments for learning where required, with the classroom teacher, student and/or parent or carer.
- Strong evidence of ability to work as a team, and ability to manage the roles of Teachers Aides for maximum effectiveness.
- Experience in the documentation process required for the NCCD process.
- Confidence in conducting professional development for staff.
- Experience in or have a knowledge of evidence-based teaching programs such as Sounds Write or similar.
