
Currently, if you have any orange pants/leggings or tops that will fit the kids, please bring them in to school.

The theme for our class this term is *Care for Country*. We will be learning the importance of giving back to our environment that sustains us through the study of various poets, artists and by conversing with a school located in the heart of the Australian desert. From our first Zoom session with Kintore, we learnt that they eat camels for medicine!!! We didn't see that coming! We also learnt that *Kipara* means bush turkey and that they go hunting for goannas, kangaroos and bush tomatoes... Hopefully we can show off our tomatoes from the garden soon!

Term Three has started in top gear with preparations for The Lorax moving along in leaps and bounds. Luckily, we had a grounding beginning with the **Smoking Ceremony** presented by Peter and John Roberts on our first morning. With a walk through the cleansing smoke and an ochre face paint, we were ready for the big term ahead. And big it is.

We have started on the whole school production of **The Lorax** with the Fashionista Dance Troop beginning their rehearsals with Freya, the props crew beginning the backdrops with Ishta and the class groups learning their circus routines with Simon and Tanya. It's already looking good.

Still to come is the live music group to add to the spectacular show, with students learning pieces with multiple parts and instrumentation.

As well as that, this term, we are doing a couple of integrated units. *The Wonders of Eggs* and *The Importance of Healthy Soil* are two Science/Geography/English topics that we will be focusing on. And a continuation of the PDHPE/English unit focused of **Emotional Intelligence**, now moving into the process of conflict resolution, building on the emotional literacy from last term. These skills will be developed within the context of the Science, Geography and Personal Development content.

It is wonderful to see the students embracing the new insights into successful word-smithing. Part of this will be refining their persuasive techniques so be ready for some strong negotiation skills.

No toys, sweets, money or mobile phones are allowed to be brought to school or on the bus.

Please be aware that the school may need to go back into lockdown due to a rise in COVID-19 cases in NSW and QLD.

Should this happen, staff will provide assistance and learning materials to support your child's learning at home.

REMEMBER TO CHECK IN

Use the QR code or sign in at the office.

From Monday 12 July 2021 the Service NSW QR code will be mandatory at all workplaces and retail businesses, including all early education and care facilities.

Adults entering the premises need to check in using the Service NSW QR codes. This means staff, families, and visitors to the school. Children are excluded from this requirement.

COVID Precautions:

In addition to the hygiene and safety measures we have already put in place, the NSW Health have made the following recommendations to minimise the risk of COVID-19 transmission in NSW school communities. *These measures will be effective as of Thursday, 4 March 2021.*

- In accordance with advice from NSW Health, parents and carers are reminded **NOT** to send children to school if they are unwell, even if they have the mildest flu-like symptoms.
- NSW Health has requested that schools encourage anyone who is unwell or has even mild flu-like symptoms, to arrange to be tested through their local medical practitioner or one of the COVID-19 clinics.
- Students and staff with flu-like symptoms need to be tested and provide a copy of a negative COVID-19 test result **and** be symptom-free before being permitted to return to school.
- Students who do not undertake a COVID-19 test will not be permitted to return to school for a 10-day period. Additionally, they must be symptom-free for at least 3 days prior to returning to school.
- Students who have seasonal allergic rhinitis or another condition that presents similarly to flu-like symptoms are still required to get tested for COVID-19 and return a negative test result. Where their symptoms continue beyond 10 days, students should provide documentation from their GP confirming their symptoms are typical for their condition.
- If any person in your family has been tested, then all members of the family must stay home until a negative result is obtained. No student is to be at school if a family member has been tested and is awaiting their results. More information can be found at www.health.nsw.gov.au

We ask you to help us by:

- 1. trying to make the settling in process as quick as possible so as to avoid too many people in the school. To help us limit the number of children and adults in the school setting, please don't hang around and try to avoid bringing other members with you.
- 2. not allowing your child to bring in toys from home.
- 3. ensuring you are packing a water bottle and enough food for the day. Students have fruit at munch and crunch, a recess and lunch.
- 4. on arriving home, getting your child/ren wash their hands and change their clothes to avoid spreading anything to your family.


